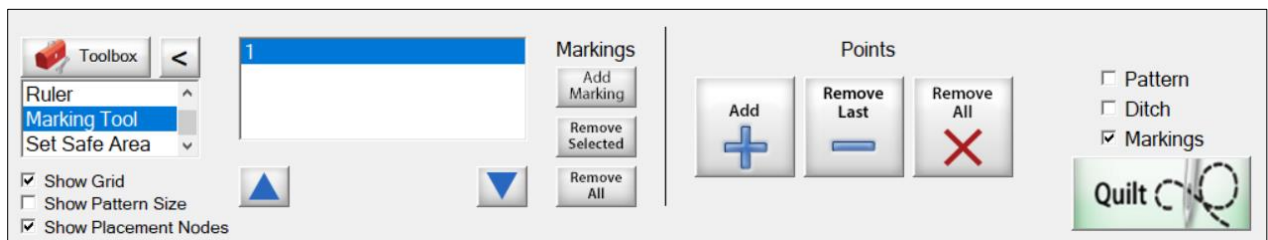


Marking Tool

Use this option to mark and sew a defined line sort of like using channel locks. You can also use this method to create a straight line at the top or sides of your quilt for placing the straight edge of the quilt or for basting top/sides. This is a great alternative for creating straight vertical and horizontal lines for quilting.

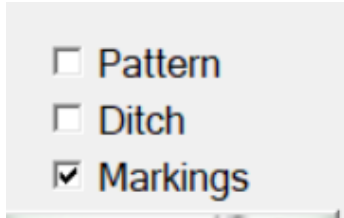
- Choose Select & Sew. Choose a block pattern. You do not have to set the pattern. Select Toolbox, select Marking Tool. You can also access Marking Tool from Plug-ins at the top right of the screen.
- Move your sewing machine needle over to the area on your quilt that you would like to begin stitching. Tap Add Point. Move to the next area you want to add a point to for a straight line. As you add points, a line shows on the screen.

Note: If the line is not straight, select Remove Last and move the machine slightly until you get a straight line and Add Point.



- Tap on Remove Last to remove the last point added. Tap Remove All to remove all points added.
- **If using this to sew a line for quilt placement or for any type of line markings for sewing, check Markings and uncheck Pattern before quilting.**
- To add a separate line, tap on Add Marking when the first line is complete. You will get an on-screen keyboard to name the second line. Note: by default, the first line is already named "1". Type a name for the 2nd line and Enter. Move needle to where the second line needs to start and tap on Add. Continue until all desired lines have been added. When multiple lines are added, tap on Remove Selected to remove only the selected line or tap on Remove All to remove all lines.

- Once your pattern is ready to quilt, there are three selections to choose from regarding what you want to stitch, Pattern, Ditch, and Markings. One Point and Two Points placement will only have Pattern and Markings to select.



- **Pattern** – selected by default. If you do not want the pattern to be stitched, tap on the checkmark to deselect it.
- **Ditch** – tap on to stitch straight lines around the pattern. This will be a separate step if you do not want the ditch and pattern to touch.
Note: if you only wanted to stitch a Ditch line, you can select any pattern.
- **Markings** – tap on to stitch marking lines.
Note: if you only wanted to stitch a Marking line, you can select any pattern
